Uniform


Pupils are to attend school in full school uniform. School uniforms can be purchased through Signature Schools – www.signatureschools.co.uk

Health Promoting School

Fleming Fulton School promotes healthy eating. A healthy diet is one of the best ways of maintaining young people's health, both now and in the future. Research has shown that diets of some young people are not meeting government recommendations for optimum growth and development.

Our school supports the '5 a day' campaign to encourage children to eat 5 portions of fruit and vegetables a day.

Immediate benefits from healthy eating include:

Preventing dental decay, obesity and anaemia.

Improving concentration and behaviour.

Aims of Fleming Fulton School Healthy Eating Policy:

To ensure that we are giving consistent and up to date messages about food and health to the children.

To give our pupils the information they need to make healthy choices.

To provide opportunities for pupils to develop their knowledge skills and attitudes towards developing healthy, safe lifestyles.

To appreciate the benefits of a healthy diet.

To encourage all children to take part in the '5 a day' campaign'.

To make informed choices and contribute to the healthy development of all members of our school community.

To encourage the drinking of water during the school day.

Staff, both teachers and classroom assistants, will actively encourage all pupils to eat at least one portion of fruit per day.

Communication

As a school we know the importance of effective communication, and we are striving to improve our methods of communication with our parents. We all have a common goal and that is to do the best for the pupils we teach. We know together we are better and therefore we have introduced some new methods of communication. We would emphasize if you have any concerns to contact the school.

Below are some of the main methods we will use to communicate:

ParentMail/SeeSaw

We use the ParentMail service which is used by over 2500 schools across the UK to communicate with parents by email and text message. This method of communicating is not only more cost effective but is also quick and allows us to provide up to date information more frequently throughout the year. SeeSaw is also used as means of communication and allows staff to share photos and videos of your son/daughter.

Monthly Newsletter

We will be sending a monthly newsletter home which will contain key dates and information to ensure you are up to date.

Social Media

The school has a X (formerly Twitter) account, and we post regularly about class trips, upcoming events and important dates. Find us on X by typing @Fleming Fulton and follow us for up-to-date information.

We also have a school Facebook page. This will be used as a means of communication only. *Please do not post concerns or queries* on the Facebook page as they will not be responded to. It is important if you have a query or concern to contact the school immediately. The Facebook page will be closely monitored and will be used to share information only.

Together we are better, it takes three, the school, the pupil and the parents and we are committed to ensuring that are partnership with parents continues to go from strength to strength as we continue with our common goal, to provide the best care and education for the pupils in our school.

Board of Governors

What do we do as Board of Governors?

As a Governing Body of the school, we work alongside the school Principal and Senior Leadership Team in:

- setting the school's vision and aims
- establishing and maintaining the school's ethos
- setting the school's plans and policies
- monitoring and evaluating school performance
- promoting self-evaluation to sustain school improvement

As Governors we are very proud to serve the Fleming Fulton School Community and take pride in the achievements and progress of the children and young people. We believe alongside the school, that the children and young people are at the centre of our school community, and we are committed to ensuring that their wellbeing and learning needs are of the highest standard, ensuring that every child and young person reaches their full potential in an inclusive, caring environment and in full partnership with the school, home, and the wider community.

A Governor is appointed to the Board of Governors for a period of 4 years. At the end of 4 years the Board of Governors is 'reconstituted' by the Department of Education, at which stage a Governor may elect to stay on for a further term and new Governors may be appointed to the Board. A Parent Governor and a Teacher Governor will also be elected to the Board during 'reconstitution'. The next scheduled reconstitution for Governors will be during the academic year 2023-24.

Society has a duty to protect children and young people from physical, sexual or emotional abuse and from neglect.

Most children and young people are not abused, but for those who are it is often the concern shown by teachers or other people in the education system that leads to their protection from further abuse.

This fact is recognised by the Department of Education which requires all those working in Education to co-operate with Social Services and other agencies in order to safeguard children and young people and protect them from harm.

Child abuse is completely unacceptable and may also be a criminal offence.

School Documents

Several of the school's policy statements and documents make reference to safety and welfare during the course of the working day.
